

Coastal Kids Foundation Grants

On December 5, 2007, the Bay-Osos Kiwanis Community Foundation will award three \$1,000 grants to nonprofit agencies, schools and businesses that serve children in Los Osos and Morro Bay.

Grants made from the Foundation's "Coastal Kids Fund" support children's programs that address the health, happiness, education and safety of children through age 14 specifically in Los Osos and Morro Bay.

The goal of the Coastal Kids Fund—just one category of giving within the Foundation—is to support youth programs that provide significant benefits in recreation, arts, education, health, social services and community enhancement including pre-school and after-school programs.

Eligibility

To be eligible to receive a grant, an organization must have a current tax-exempt status from the Internal Revenue Service under Section 501(c)(3) or a current business license that indicates a Los Osos or Morro Bay business address.

Application Deadline: Friday, October 26, 5pm

Grants will be awarded December 5, 2007.

The Foundation combines charitable gifts, money raised by the Kiwanis Club and support from local businesses to create an enduring source of funds that will support non-profit agencies, school programs and community projects now and into the future. Grants stay local, and nearly all overhead costs have been eliminated since administrative positions are filled by Kiwanis members and other community volunteers.

Programs currently supported by Bay-Osos Kiwanis include: Area Council of the Boy Scouts of America, Morro Bay recreation programs, South Bay Community Center, and sports and academics programs for students in Morro Bay High School, Los Osos Middle School and Los Osos Elementary Schools.
